Key Areas of Learning and Values

This term's values are Caring and Respect

We will reflect on these values when discussing behaviour for learning and interactions with others to try and bring out the best in ourselves and those around us.

As Historians, we will use different sources of evidence to answer key questions about the Romans. We will make comparisons between historical periods explaining things that have changed and things, which have stayed the same. We will be learning about aspects of daily life in Roman times, focusing specifically on the lives of the rich and that of the poor; exploring the invasion of Britain by the Romans, looking at the story of Boudicca, Roman Gods and exploring the story of Pompeii.

Maths

The children will:

- Continue to develop their understanding of number, writing, ordering and comparing numbers to 100 and 1000.
- Practise multiplication, focusing on 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10x and related division facts.
- Practise telling the time.
- Develop understanding of money and the value of different coins

English

The children will:

- Listen to, retell and read a range of stories;
- Sequence stories and real life events;
- Work on speaking and listening skills;
- Continue to develop reading spelling of key words and phonics spelling patterns;
- Develop their handwriting.

Science

As scientists, we are going to specialise on living things and their habitats. We will identify common habitats and the insects that live in them around the locality of the school field and garden area.

Life Skills

- Personal organisation of belongings and school property;
- Focus on hygiene including hand-washing and brushing teeth;
- Road safety;
- Money and shopping

Social

- Turn-taking games in learning and play;
- Learning how we can care for each other and make others smile.
- Work on recognising our own emotions and the feelings of others.
