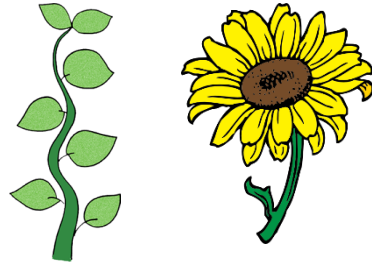

Prime Areas of Learning

are fundamental to children's development. They run through and support learning in all other areas.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Children will be:

- With support, sharing resources, taking turns and accepting the needs of others.
- Enjoys responsibility of carrying out small tasks.
- Showing friendly behaviour and continuing good relationships with adults and peers.

Communication and Language / Philosophy for Children (P4C)

Children will be:

- Listening to others.
- Sharing news and retelling stories.
- Understanding & answering 'how' and 'why' questions in P4C sessions.
- Speaking in sentences.

Physical Development

Children will be:

- Developing self-care skills, such as getting dressed independently and hand washing.
- Developing gross motor skills by moving in different ways.
- Developing fine motor skills, by drawing, painting, making and cutting.

Specific Areas of Learning

The specific areas include essential skills and knowledge. They grow out of the prime areas, and provide important contexts for learning.

Literacy

Reading

Children will be:

- Reading, retelling and role-playing stories.
- Sharing stories, rhymes and poems every day.

Writing

Children will be:

- Writing their names, labels and stories.
- Reading stories and instructions.
- Taking part in daily phonics sessions.

Mathematics

Numbers

Children will be:

- Counting and recognising numbers.
- Reciting numbers in order to 10 and beyond.
- Matching numeral and quantity.

Shape, Space, Shape and Measures

- Comparing and ordering weight, size, and length.
- Naming and describing 2-d and 3-d shapes.

Understanding the World

Children will be:

- Talking about special events for themselves and learning about others.
- Identifying similarities and differences.
- Going on Welly Walks.
- Using the computer and technological toys.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will be:

- Story-telling in play.
- Constructing with a purpose.
- Experimenting with media, textures and colour.
- Singing songs and nursery rhymes.
