<p>Scenario 1 My child/and or another member of the household is awaiting test results and therefore required to self isolate. 	From Day 2	<p>Daily English and Maths - these will follow on from/mirror the lessons taught in class. <p>Scenario 2 My child has to isolate for 14 days in total because a member of the household has tested positive for COVID-19. The rest of their school bubble are attending school and being taught as normal.</p>	Once a positive test result has been received – 14 days calculated from the first day of onset o	<p>Within the first 48 hours of parents notifying school of a positive test result, the class teacher will telephone them to make contact. (Between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4.30 p.m.) The purpose of this telephone call is:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • for the teacher to ‘touch base’ with parents about their child’s well-being • for the teacher to provide additional explanation about the weekly plan • to discuss any questions parents might have • to agree further contact between school and home as is appropriate and reasonable 	Daily learning will be available from 9am. If child is unwell they are not expected to complete the work.	To be agreed during initial phone call.

<p>Scenario 3 My child's whole bubble is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p>The teacher is not the person experiencing COVID symptoms and the reason for the closure of the bubble.</p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<p>Daily by 9am</p>	<p>Daily Welcome video from teacher.</p> <p>Daily Spelling, Maths meeting and Daily Times tables uploaded at the start of the week.</p> <p>Daily English and Maths - as for scenario 2, these will follow on from/mirror the lessons taught in class. They may include a combination of videos and the screens shared in the classroom along with resources/worksheets. Please refer to the weekly plan for further information.</p> <p>Broader curriculum - This learning will be timetabled to take place on different days throughout the week as would normally happen if the children were attending school in person. During the daily welcome and introduction, the teacher will inform children of which 'broader curriculum' subjects they will be working on during the day. In case of a longer lockdown this work will be uploaded at the start of the week so that children can choose which days to complete the work.</p>		<p>Maths and English should be handed in daily on Google Classroom. Either by uploading the worksheets or photos of written work.</p> <p>Broader Curriculum work should be handed in at the end of the week</p>

<p>In addition to the above all children should be engaging in daily reading with this being recorded in reading record books . Further Maths and English activities can be accessed on the Learning Zone page on our school website. Purple Mash can also be accessed using your child's log in details.</p>
